- 3- Prophet Muhammad used to recite surah Al-Falaq after every prayer.



VERSE-BY-VERSE EXPLANATION

1. "Say, I seek refuge in the Lord of the daybreak,"

- This verse encourages us to turn to Allah, who is the Creator of everything and who can protect us from all harm. Al-Falaq means "Daybreak" signifies light and safety after darkness, symbolizing Allah's power to bring good out of every hardship.

2. "From the evil of what He created,"

- Here, we seek Allah's protection from any potential harm that may come from His creation. This includes natural dangers, as well as harmful intentions from others. It reminds us that Allah, who created everything, is also the best protector against any harm.

3. "And from the evil of darkness when it settles,"

- This verse asks for protection against the evil of the night, when fears and hidden dangers may arise. The night can sometimes bring about worry or harm that is unseen, reminding us of Allah's light and protection during darker times.

4. "And from the evil of the blowers in knots,"

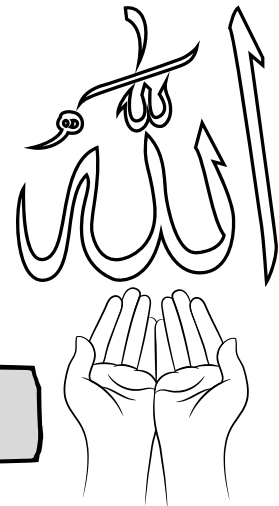
- This refers to people who engage in harmful practices, such as magic or other superstitions meant to harm others. By seeking Allah's protection, we remember that no magic or ill intent has power over us when Allah is our protector.

5. "And from the evil of an envier when he envies."

- Finally, we seek Allah's protection from envy or jealousy. Envy can lead people to wish harm upon others, but Allah's protection shields us from any harm caused by others.

THE MAIN THEMES OF SURAH AL-FALAQ

KEY LESSONS FROM SURAH AL-FALAQ

1. **Allah is Our Protector:** This surah shows us that we can turn to Allah whenever we feel unsafe or worried. He is the best helper and protector.
2. **Different Kinds of Harm:** We learn that harm can come from nature, the night, magic or even the jealousy of people. Allah can protect us from all of these.
3. **Power of Prayer:** This surah teaches us that asking Allah for help is powerful. When we pray sincerely, we are safe in His care.
4. **Relying on Allah Over Fear:** Instead of being afraid of magic, jealousy, or dark times, we should put our trust in Allah. His protection is stronger than anything that could hurt us.
