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ABOUT THE SURAH

Surah Al-Humazah is the 104th Surah in the order of the Quran. It is one of the Meccan surahs, revealed in Mecca, and it addresses certain negative behaviors that some people practiced at that time, warning them of the consequences of these actions.



THE MEANING OF THE AYAT

1- "Woe to every slanderer and backbiter":

The surah begins with a strong warning to those who intentionally harm others by speaking ill of them behind their backs (slander) or mocking them through actions like winking (backbiting).

2- "Who amasses wealth and counts it":

This verse refers to those who accumulate a lot of wealth and continually count and measure it, but do not spend it on good causes or helping others.

3- "He thinks that his wealth will make him immortal":

This person believes that wealth will allow them to live forever, thinking that money is the only means to achieve happiness and that it provides security and immortality.

4- "No! He will surely be thrown into the Crusher":

Here, the decisive response from Allah indicates that this person will be cast into "Al-Hutamah," one of the names of Hell, where they will be subjected to torment. "Al-Hutamah" is the fire that crushes everything.

5- "And what can make you know what is the Crusher?":

This verse asks, "What can make you, O Muhammad ﷺ, know the severity of its punishment and the intensity of its torment?"

6- "It is the fire of Allah, [eternally] fueled":

This is the great fire prepared by Allah, a blazing fire that continues to burn without ever being extinguished.

7- "Which rises over the hearts":

The fire of Hell is unlike any other; it reaches the hearts and causes intense pain from within, not just in the body.

8- "Indeed, it will be closed down upon them":


This fire will be sealed upon these slanderers and backbiters; they will not be able to escape or find any relief.

9- "In extended columns":

This verse indicates that these people will be bound in long columns, preventing them from fleeing or moving, which will only add to their suffering.

Conclusion:

Surah Al-Humazah is a reminder for every Muslim to act and speak with kindness, avoiding mocking or harming others in any way. It also reminds us to use wealth in ways that please Allah, and to always remember that the true value lies not in the amount of money one has, but in the righteous deeds that can save a person from the torment of Hell on the Day of Judgment—a punishment that no one can endure.
